Hours may vary due to world language and math placements, AP or dual enrollment coursework, and actual classes transferred to UI. 120 hours are required to earn a bachelor's degree. Review your transcripts with the Biology advisor to create an individualized plan of study. Biomedical Science students who come to UI with less than the above science transfer recommendations, may have to take the MCAT later and plan a gap year, and/or finish in 3 years at UI instead of two.
